In Memory of Eenok Haamer-Founder of TAT

On February 27, God called the founder of Tartu Academy of Theology and Estonia's oldest Lutheran pastor, Eenok Haamer (89), into eternity. His funeral took place on March 8 in Mustvee, at the church where he faithfully served with his wife Eha, despite his advanced age, as a pastor for 61 years, **Eenok followed** in his father's footsteps, and his three sons continue his ministry.

He was a man of God, a steadfast prayer warrior, and a spiritual father for so many people. He prayed for a revival in Estonia. Our prayer is that Eenok and his prayers may be the fertile seed for the emergence of a spiritual revival. Please join with us in this prayer.

Eenok established TAT in 1992, shortly after Estonia was freed from 50 years of Soviet oppression. He felt a calling to rebuild the Christian church that had been deeply damaged during that time. Despite many challenges along the way, the work has continued. The blessings of his obedience and vision are still unfolding and will continue to impact generations to come.

Empowering Estonian Business Leaders To Give

Two recent fundraising gala dinners brought together Estonian business leaders to support vital areas of ministry: pastoral care and pastors training.

On November 21, 2024, in cooperation with the Lutheran Church Seminary, we hosted a gala in Tallinn to support theological education. Held in the Seminary's largest classroom, the event welcomed forty-three guests and raised \$17,680. Theological education is not a business—it relies on donors to thrive. This event resumed a tradition paused since 2019 due to the pandemic and war.



On March 31, 2025, we held a gala at Home of Hope in Tartu, focused on supporting our pastoral care ministry. Thirty-onevh guests joined us for an evening of stories, fellowship, and insight into our daily work. Our caregivers shared how this ministry is uniquebecause we never walk alone. God is present in every encounter, enabling us to bring hope even in the darkest situations.



The evening raised \$19,940, covering a large portion of our pastoral care ministry's annual budget.

Moving forward, gala dinners will be a yearly tradition, with 2 events annually:

- A spring event in Tartu to support mission work through Home of Hope
- An autumn event in Tallinn to raise funds for theological education for pastors

We're encouraged by the growing generosity of our supporters and are committed to expanding the community of those who share a heart for mission.

Young Adult Conference 'The Juggler'

This year's 'The Juggler' conference brought together **over 70 participants**, some of whom contributed in various roles to make the event happen. Attendees ranged from teenagers to those in their forties, with an average age of around 28.

The program focused on the theme of communication—how we communicate, how God communicates with us, what we can learn from Jesus' interactions, and how to stay grounded amid information overload.

Topics included team communication, active listening, conflict resolution, and giving constructive feedback. These were explored by experienced speakers who work in these areas daily and draw wisdom from their walk with God.

Participants not only listened to inspiring talks but also engaged through Q&A sessions and discussion groups. The conference also featured fun moments like prize draws and a quiz night.

We're grateful for the positive feedback and the warm, home-like atmosphere at Home of Hope. Looking ahead, we aim to improve logistics and grow our core team.
