ABOUT THE PERSECUTION PILGRIMAGE

The Persecution Pilgrimage in Estonia offers a unique opportunity to become part of the story of spiritual resistance, unwavering trust in God, and the suffering endured by an entire nation. To deepen your understanding of this history and its trials, we will guide you through the journey of one Christian family and their country. You will hear firsthand accounts of persecution and gain insight into what it truly means to suffer for your faith. This experience will strengthen your relationship with God and reinforce the truth that there is no room for hopelessness in a life of faith.

Estonia was occupied for 50 years after World War II by the aggressive, atheistic Soviet Union, which sought to destroy the nation's deep Christian roots. Sadly, they were largely successful. During the first 10 years of occupation, two-thirds of Lutheran pastors were killed, imprisoned, or forced to flee. Estonia lost one in every five of its citizens—more than 200,000 people—due to Soviet terror. Before the war, 98% of Estonians identified as Christians. Today, only about 10-12% are affiliated with a Christian church.

This pilgrimage will lead you along the path that **Pastor Eenok Haamer** walked during the most difficult and formative years of his life. His father, **Pastor Harri Haamer**, was arrested in 1948 and sent to a Siberian slave labor camp. The family was in danger of deportation to Siberia, and to escape it, Eenok, his mother, and his brother hid in the forest for six years—spending nearly four years in an underground bunker.

Pilgrimage participants will have the opportunity to visit the exact locations where Eenok hid, accompanied by his son, **Pastor Siimon Haamer**. You will hear the full story and learn about the miraculous provision of God they experienced.

Additionally, we will explore Estonia's broader suffering under communism, helping participants to better understand the context of current events, including the war in Ukraine.
